An effective and energized advocate for at-risk children, Jan works at the SERVE Center in the National Center for Homeless Education (NCHE). Through her consistent and dedicated work, Jan makes innumerable valuable contributions to the SERVE Center. One of those contributions is answering the NCHE helpline. In this activity, Jan assists staff of state departments of education, staff of school districts, parents, and youth living on their own with issues related to homeless and highly mobile students enrolling and succeeding in school.
