Ready for the IEP?

The season we affectionately call IEP season is upon us! With any season, it is good to gather together what you need before you need it. Our suggestions on things you need to successfully prepare for your student's IEP meeting: the student's current IEP, their progress reports, the student's most current ETR and a proposed IEP draft. Sitting down to see how your student made progress in their current IEP can help you look at the proposed IEP draft with a fresh perspective. Have they met any goals? Do they need new goals? Do they need a different instruction on the same goal? As you go through all the documents, be sure to write down all of your questions to share with the team a few days before the meeting. If you would like someone else to go over your documents with you, reach out to your Parent Mentor and set up a time to meet!

Executive function: Implications for education

This is the time to observe your child's executive functioning skills. Students rely on executive functions to perform activities such as planning, organizing, strategizing, paying attention and remembering details, and managing time and space. Check out the list below to learn more about executive functions:

- Self-regulation: Managing strong emotions and inhibiting impulsive behaviors
- Attention: Sustaining focus, especially for multi-part tasks
- Task Initiation: Starting a non-preferred task
- Organization: Maintaining materials at home and in school
- Planning: Mapping out multi-step tasks such as longer-term class projects
