About the Presenter:



- house lights remaining on during the performance
- reduction of loud jarring sounds and strobe lighting
- accommodated house rules that allow audience members to talk and move about during the performance
- a designated Take A Break Space where sensory needs can be fulfilled while others can still enjoy the performance

Recognizing that families of individuals with extrasensory and other needs often have additional financial obligations to provide specialized therapy and care for their family members, NPB offers these families tickets at a reduced price.
