# **TIP CORNER**

Understanding the Present Levels of Academic Achievement and Functional Performance statement (PLAAFP) A student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) team expects special education services to help the student meet their unique needs and prepare him or her for further education, employment, and independent living.

As a foundation for higher achievement and IEP goals, the IEP team will identify:

- The child's current levels of learning or performance
- The effect or impact of the child's disability on learning

This process can be compared to planning a trip to another city: You need to know where you are beginning as well as what may make your trip more challenging. The team will see where your child is beginning and how the disability impacts learning. For more information, click <u>HERE</u>.

### **Study Participation Opportunity!**




